Review of Public Administration: Policy Paper 19, Education Advisory Forum (EAF)

Since the announcement regarding the Review of Public Administration (RPA) in November 2005, the Department of Education has been consulting with stakeholders in order to develop specific proposals for legislation.

The Department of Education has issued a number of high level policy papers relating to the Review of Public Administration (RPA) for public consultation since December 2006. At that time, the Department indicated that several further high level policy papers were still under development, and would be subject to public consultation at a later time. I am now attaching the latest of these papers (Policy Paper 19), regarding proposals for the establishment of an Education Advisory Forum. This draft policy has been developed to take account of relevant views and concerns expressed by some stakeholders in response to previous RPA policies.

A copy of policy paper 21 (Sectoral Support arrangements post-RPA) is also attached. You will note that among the activities to be supported by the provision of funding for professional capacity is a representational and advocacy role in regard to relationships with the Department, the ESA, other Departments and the EAF. You should note that policy paper 21 was previously consulted upon, and is attached now for your information only.

I have also attached the outcome of the screening exercise undertaken to determine the impacts of the high level policy set out in paper 19 on equality of opportunity, as well as other key dimensions. Although the high level policy has been determined to have a neutral impact, stakeholders should be aware that further screening may also be carried out on specific decisions made as a result of the final policy.

Comments on the policy paper and the preliminary screening would be welcomed, and should be sent to the address below by the 11th June 2009.
